#### STEP 3: A & B

- The resolutions are written for the AFFIRMATIVE position.
- Topics are a first-come-first-serve basis.
- Go show your partner the resolution.

Person \_\_\_\_\_ gets to pick position: Affirmative or Negative.

- Each opponent take out your outline template that was given to you yesterday.
- Write the exact wording of your resolution.

#### STEP 4: WRITE THE PLAN

- Sample: Plan to Allow Genetic Engineering/Cloning
